### Asiime Jennifer



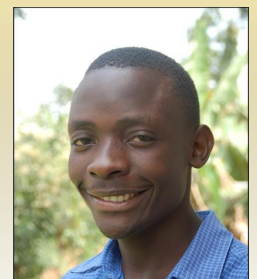
